



# Performance that counts

*Measures of safety, health, environmental and social performance are important indicators of a company's long-term success.*

In measuring a company's success, financial numbers often attract the most attention. But earnings and dividends aren't the only numbers that count. Measures of a company's safety, health, environmental and social performance also play a vital role as indicators of commitment to long-term success.

A company that takes a systematic, result-oriented approach to promoting and protecting employees, communities and the environment is likely a company that is built to succeed over the long-term.

We share this information publicly through our corporate citizenship reports. Last month, we released our 2005 report, detailing our performance in these important areas. The newly-released report includes such highlights as:

- Our best year ever in preventing oil spills. Our marine vessels – owned or long-term leased – did not have a single spill of more than 1 barrel of oil all year. In 2005, our vessels spilled less than 1 teaspoon of oil

for every 4 million litres transported.

- Our continued leadership in safety and health. Our global workforce had proportionally fewer lost time safety incidents than any company in our industry.
- Our increasing investment in energy-saving cogeneration technology. With this program alone, we deliver a 9 million tonne annual reduction in carbon dioxide emissions – the equivalent of taking 4 million cars off Europe's roads.
- Our 25 % increase in community investment worldwide. These include our Africa Health Initiative to address malaria, and our new Educating Women and Girls Initiative, improving opportunities for women in developing countries.

Behind each of these indicators that we measure lie individual stories of how the people of ExxonMobil work with their colleagues and in their communities to find ways of continuously improving our citizenship performance. A performance that counts.
